1. Conference Venue

2. Accommodation


The Secretariat has organized 40 block booked rooms at the main Conference venue, namely the Edgewater Resort and Spa. Accommodation has been arranged for participants at the rate of NZD\$304.00 (Garden Superior room type). The OCO and Cook Islands Customs will assist late registrations with their accommodation but can't make any guarantees. Given that this is a peak period for the Cook Islands, all self-funded delegates to the Conference are encouraged to book your room(s) as soon as possible to avoid any disappointment.

3. Travel Logistics, Hotel Transfers and Points of Contact

Conference Planning Committee consist of Cook Islands Customs and OCO Secretariat staff and will be present at the Rarotonga International Airport to welcome participants on arrival and to assist with arrival formalities, luggage pick-up and airport transfers to the hotel. **Note** a 'Special Lane' will be assigned for all Conference participants to assist in clearing Immigration and Customs at the Rarotonga International Airport. Look for the sign "OCO Conference."

Transfers from the airport to the Edgewater Resort (and return), and to dinner venues back to Edgewater will be organized by Cook Islands Customs.

4. Dress Code

As hosts, the Conference Planning Committee have agreed that for the official opening ceremony on the first day, conference participants are required to wear their full national Customs uniform or formal business attire. The dress code (button and polo shirts) will be provided by Cook Islands Customs and OCO for the remaining two days;

- Day 2 (Tuesday 30th July) the Cook Islands Customs issued button and polo shirt.
- Day 3 (Wednesday 31st July) the OCO Secretariat issued button down shirt.

5. Immigration and Visa Requirements

Kindly be advised that all international passport holders must have a passport valid for a period of at least 6 months beyond their departure date from the Cook Islands. All New Zealand and Australian passport holders are allowed 90 days of stay in the Cook Islands, and all other international passport holders are allowed 31 days of stay, with an extension of up to another 31 days at no fee. You must have evidence of a valid outbound ticket or return ticket to your port of origin. On arrival in Rarotonga, you will need to show your air ticket confirmation (printed or digital) to an immigration officer. Note you must have proof of accommodation during your stay in the Cook Islands. On arrival in Rarotonga, you will need to show your accommodation booking confirmation (printed or digital) to an immigration officer.

6. Telecommunications

Vodafone Cook Islands is the current mobile provider for telecommunications services in the country. 4G+ mobile data is available on Rarotonga. There are WiFi hotspots at prime locations spread across all islands.

You can get a preloaded Vodafone Cook Islands Travel SIM card. These are available at the Vodafone store at the Rarotonga International Airport just as you exit the arrival hall, open every international flight – day or night. Travel SIM cards are preloaded with mobile data, calling minutes, and TXTs to anywhere in the world. Click <u>https://help.vodafone.co.ck/article/146-visitor-simcard</u> to check out their traveler plans available. Check with your current mobile provider to see if your device


is network locked (as it may need to be unlocked before your visit. Vodafone's Travel SIM cards are also available as an eSIM.

Wi-Fi will be available at the Edgewater Resort and Spa where the participants are accommodated.

7. Electricity

In the Cook Islands, they use the same type of plug/outlet, as you would find in New Zealand and Australia, the type I plug with slanted prongs. Cook Islands has Type 1 power plugs with 240v AC 50Hz, so if your appliances don't fit the electrical outlets and/or require a different voltage or frequency, then you're going to need a travel adapter and maybe even a converter.

It is advisable that you purchase a universal power adapter.



8. Currency and Banking

The Cook Islands unit of currency is the New Zealand dollar (NZD), supplemented by local coins. The unique local coins and notes are not legal tender outside of the Cook Islands but are keenly sought by collectors worldwide.

Bank of the South Pacific (BSP), Bank of the Cook Islands (BCI) and Australia & New Zealand Banking Group Limited (ANZ) are located in downtown Avarua. Open Monday-Friday from 9 am-3 pm

Foreign currency exchange is available on the island of Rarotonga only, via the Bank of the Cook Islands and Western Union/No.1 Currency Exchange, located in the Avarua town area. Foreign currency exchange options offered are:

• Bank of the Cook Islands: USD, AUD, FJD, CAD, GBP, XPF

Western Union/No.1 Currency Exchange: USD, AUD, GBP, FRF, EUR, CAD, FJD

9. International Time

Cook Islands' time is GMT-10 hours. UTC -10:00 hours. Do your calculation before arrival, as booking accommodation to start a day too late is a common mistake.

10. Official Language

The official languages of the Cook Islands are Cook Islands Maori and English, English is widely spoken on the island of Rarotonga. While Cook Islands Maori is predominantly used in the outer islands (Pa Enua) of the Cook Islands.

11. Climate

The Cook Islands enjoy a pleasantly warm and sunny climate all year round!

June to August - Cooler months – it can get cold at times, so bring something warm November to March - Warmer seasons with occasional tropical showers April to November - Drier months with an average temperature of 26°C

December to March - Warmer, humid and damper season with temperatures between 22°C (min) and 31°C (max)

12. Culture

The Cook Islands is a modern Pacific nation whose people are a cosmopolitan blend of their ancient Polynesian heritage, with a European twist. There are so many ways to immerse yourself in our culture and slip into the laidback life the locals have created. Cook Islanders are happy, friendly and vibrant people who love engaging with travelers and sharing their lifestyle with their visitors. From lazing on the beach, and shopping at the markets, to enjoying local dishes and a cocktail as the sun sets at a local beach bar, the locals are right there with you, sharing in the magic and joy of island life
